The stunning floral theme continued onto the stage that hosted the musical entertainment. Fashioned to resemble

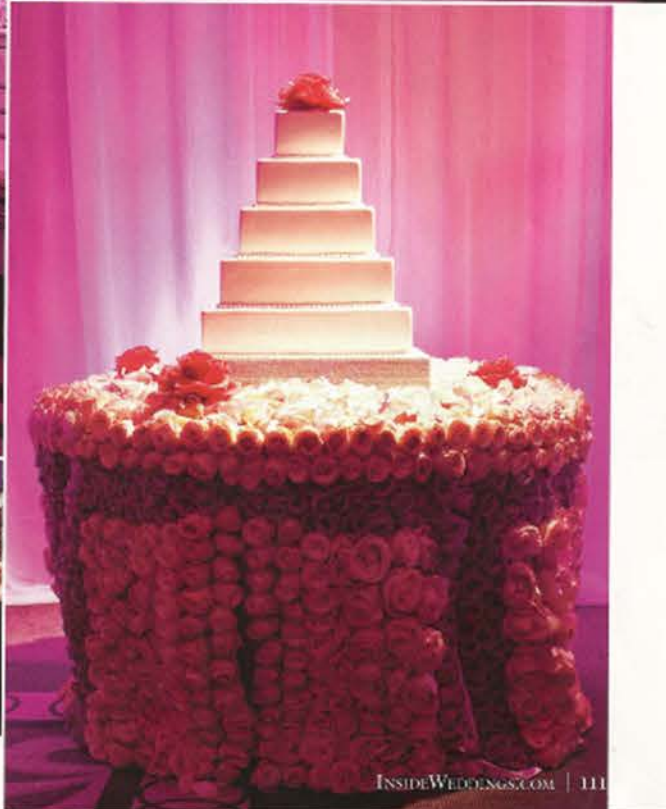
