

Vibrantly costumed professional samba dancers, sensual tango dancers, a DJ and a Brazilian percussive batucada samba band entertained the gathering. In surprise performances, two of their friends dedicated songs to the newlyweds.

Keeping with the motif of the night, an all white wedding cake was crowned with a spire of cream profiteroles, and a coffee and sweets station provided ample fuel for the after-party. Boarding a bus with a bar, music, disco balls and dancing, the late-night revelers toured Hol-

lywood and Mulholland Drive, and drove along the coast with a stop on the beach. They returned to the Bel-Air exhausted and happy.

Too busy creating perfect events for others, Edgardo and Celio have tabled the honeymoon for right now, but dreams of Bora Bora or the Maldives are high on their list for when the time is right.

Celio's parting advice for making one's wedding day the best it can be is to try not to worry. "I decided not to be picky about things that might go wrong. If I did not stress out this would be the happiest day of my life, and that's exactly what happened."
